Tips for Consumers

When selecting a qualified professional:

- Ask about the evaluator's credentials and their experience working with adults with ADHD, learning disorders, and/or autism.
- Check with your insurance provider on whether they will cover any portion of the evaluation.

When working with the professional:

- Be prepared to be forthcoming, thorough, and honest with requested information.
- Know that providers must maintain confidentiality with respect to your records and testing information.
- Tell the provider if you plan to request accommodations and will need documentation for your school. To qualify for services, documentation needs to include information on the impact of the diagnoses so that appropriate accommodations may be identified. Comprehensive evaluations for ADHD, learning disorders, and/or autism typically include the following elements.
 - Typed on office letterhead, dated, and signed by a qualified professional who is licensed, properly credentialed, and not a relative or close family friend of the student.
 - Include the name, title, and professional credentials of the provider.
 - State the diagnosed disability or disabilities, including diagnostic codes for DSM-V or ICD-10.
 - Date of diagnosis, approximate date of onset, severity, and expected progression.
 - Description of the symptoms and their current functional impact.
 - List current medications and side effects.
 - List current and past accommodations in high school, college, and/or standardized testing.
 - Recommend accommodations for the college environment and rationale for each.

As a follow-up to the assessment:

- Request a copy of the final report and maintain a personal file of your records and reports.
- Request the opportunity to discuss the results and recommendations.
- Request additional resources if you need them.
